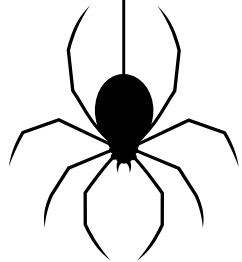
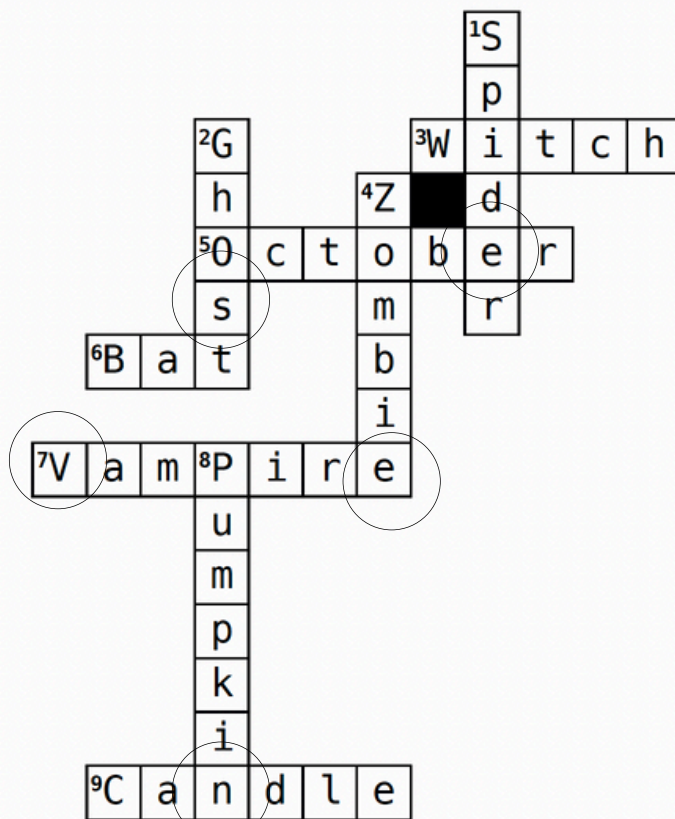


# Puzzle 1

Degrees (°F) to reduce the oven from step 1 to step 6 (50)



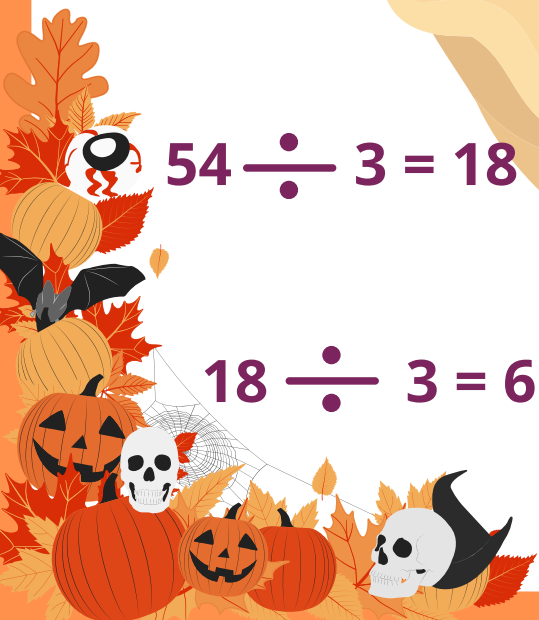
$54 \div 3 = 18$  Number of verbs used in the imperative in step 7 (3)

Number of utensils needed for this recipe (6)

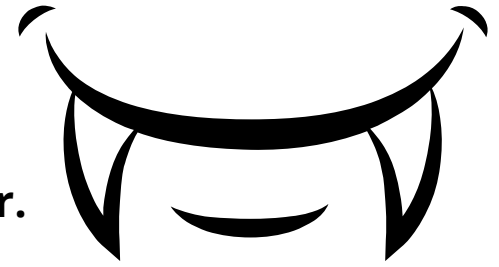
**The third digit is 6.**

“Dracula” in 1897**

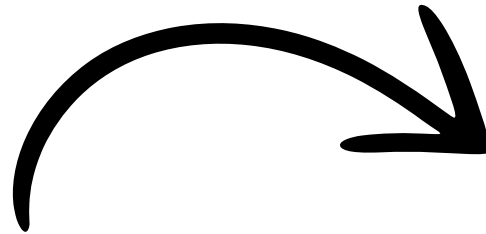
**B. Stoker was born in 1847.
