



Rookie Reporter: Brydi and the Just Like You Campaign

TRANSCRIPT of the Video:

Hi, BTN. I'm Brydi and I'm 11 years old. I live in Brisbane. And this is my family. There's Mum, Dad, my two brothers and my sister. And this is my wheelchair.

For the past three years, I've been wheelchair racing competitively.

Brydi's coach: You've got this, baby girl! Keep going!

And this year, I've started playing wheelchair basketball too.

My favorite thing about wheelchair racing and wheelchair basketball is I can go super fast, and for wheelchair basketball, it's really tough.

Some of you guys might have seen me before on BTN with some of my favorite wheelchair athletes, but today I want to tell you about something else that I've been doing.

You see, while being in a wheelchair hasn't ever held me back, having a disability can sometimes make it hard for kids at school.

When I started school, I didn't really have any friends, and a lot of the other kids used to bully me, to the point where I didn't feel like being at school.

I work hard on my self-esteem, and don't let the bullies get to me.

Sports coach: Three, two, one, launch it! Go!

A little while ago, the children's charity Variety approached me to be part of the program called Just Like You.

Children: Just Like You!

Since 2015, it's been teaching primary school kids around Australia how to accept and include people living with a disability.

BRYDI'S STORY

It gives kids with a disability a chance to share our stories with other kids, and it helps them to understand that, really, we're just like them.

Now the program has come to my home state, Queensland. I'm excited to be in the program so I can teach kids that they can overcome bullying ...

... while also showing able-bodied kids that people with a disability can do awesome things like I'm doing.

My biggest goal is to go to Paris for the Paralympics in 2024.

Brydi's coach: So proud of you, babe! Keep going! You're doing really amazing!

I'm training really hard with my coach and former Paralympian Louise Sauvage to make it to the Games.

I want to compete in the 100m, 200m and 10km races, and want to be in the wheelchair basketball team. No matter what happens, I'm going to put in my biggest effort and achieve big things.

Pistes de rédaction :

Après avoir découvert au fil de la séquence l'histoire et les valeurs des Jeux Olympiques, nos élèves devront présenter un projet de classe en binôme ou en groupe mais aussi un projet à l'échelle de l'établissement puisque les posters seront affichés et un jury sera formé pour élire les 3 plus beaux posters.

Le scénario est fictif puisqu'aucun poster ne partira en Guadeloupe mais les élèves concernés pourront recevoir un petit diplôme du meilleur poster. Voici l'intitulé exact du concours : « La ville de Baie-Mahault demande à toutes les écoles de l'académie Guadeloupe de préparer des poster pour embellir le stade où sera accueillie la flamme Olympique, participe au concours de poster que Soualiga organise, seuls 3 posters seront sélectionnés pour partir en Guadeloupe, que le meilleur gagne !

L'équipe d'anglais est concernée particulièrement les collègues concernés par les deux niveaux 6ème et 5ème.

Le professeur d'art plastique aurait pu être sollicité en pluridisciplinarité mais cela n'a pas été le cas par manque de temps.
