BULLYING

Cette fiche d'activité peut être proposée aux élèves de cycle 4 dans le cadre d'une séquence intitulée « school life », afin d'établir un lien entre les adolescents (teens) et les problèmes que ces derniers peuvent rencontrer dans leur vie scolaire ou extrascolaire.

Le harcèlement est un phénomène important et inquiétant qui concerne toutes les générations. Cette thématique peut s'inscrire dans le repère culturel « Langages » ou encore « Ecole et société ».

Elle vise à la formation de la personne et du citoyen (Domaine 3 du socle commun).

En outre, cette fiche d'activité permet de solliciter les activités langagières suivantes :

- Prendre la parole en continu et en interaction
- Lire et comprendre
- Ecrire



Activity 1: Look at the pictures below and answer the following questions

Réponses attendues :

In *picture 1*, we can see a girl who is being bullied by a group of students/pupils. At the back, we can see three girls who are gossiping about her.

Next to the bullied girl, there is a boy who is pointing at her book. The boy is making fun of her, probably because she is the new kid in school.

The girl looks very sad. She is alone and has nobody to defend her. A black boy is standing on the right hand corner. He is witnessing the scene. His hands are in his pockets. Instead of reacting, he is completely passive. He doesn't take action. He is just smiling. He is a bystander.


In **Picture 2**, a girl is being bullied by a black and a white boy. One boy is taking her school things while the other is pulling her ponytail.

Picture 3 shows a small boy who is being bullied by a big, strong boy. The big boy looks older and stronger than the little boy who seems terrified by him. The small boy is scared, terrified by the big boy (the bully).

What can you see ?


How does the boy feel ?



- · hitting people.




What is cyberbullying?

Cyberbullying happens online and includes:

- · sharing photos without permission
- not letting someone be part of an online group.

What can you do?

If someone is mean to you, tell an adult that you know and like. For example, talk to a parent or a teacher. You can block a person who sends mean messages online. Ask an adult to help you. Don't reply.







Say sorry if you are mean to someone. You can write a message or talk to the person. Think about how to be kind in the future.
